SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

Today's Gospel is the beginning of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount. We quickly note that the people whom Jesus calls "blessed" and "happy" are not people we think of as blessed or happy. . .the poor in spirit, the meek, the persecuted. This Gospel is one of reversals. Jesus' blueprint for happiness reflects little of what the world might call happiness.

"Blessed" is sometimes translated as *happy, fortunate, or favored*. In other words, Jesus is saying that divine favor is upon those who are poor, those who mourn, those who are persecuted. The Beatitudes can be understood as a framework for Christian living. Our vocation as Christians is not to be first in this world, but rather to be first in the eyes of God. By referring to the good things that the faithful will experience, Matthew reminds us that those who act in the manner described in the Beatitudes will find their reward with God.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

4th Sunday in Ordinary Time

1. From January 29th through February 5th we celebrate **Catholic Schools Week**. At this time, I would like to acknowledge all of our parish families who have chosen to enroll their children in local Catholic schools, most especially Immaculate Conception School and Delone Catholic High School. While it can be a financial sacrifice to send your child(ren) to Catholic schools, it is an investment that is proven to bear much fruit in terms of quality of education, deepening of faith and morals, and an environment that fosters holistic growth in mind, body, and spirit. If you are considering enrolling your child(ren) in Catholic grade school or high school, I would be happy to talk with you further. Next Sunday (2/5), at the 11:15am Mass, we will have IC School children and families assisting at Mass. **Let us also keep our newly-formed St. Teresa of Calcutta School in our prayers during this important time of transition!**
2. On Feb. 2nd, we celebrate the **World Day for Consecrated Life**. I would like to thank **Sr. Rosanne** for her faithful witness to consecrated religious life, and for her service to our IHM parish family.
3. **A SOUPER BOWL OF CARING** is a national effort, using the energy of the Super Bowl, to mobilize involvement to care for people in their local communities who are hungry and those in need. The Souper Bowl of Caring started in South Carolina in 1990, and it is now held from coast to coast and has been endorsed by NFL owners and former U.S. presidents. Our participation here at IHM will involve joining with other congregations of the Food Pantry to collect cans of soup and this year we will also collect bottles of ketchup, mustard, relish, BBQ sauce, salad dressing and mayonnaise. The soup or condiments can be placed on the windowsills of the church when you come to Mass on February 4/5.

In anticipation of the World Day of the Sick (on February 11th), I will be offering the **Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick** after weekend Masses on February 11th and 12th. This particular sacrament, which the Church provides for those in need on account of old age, in times of serious illness, or in advance of surgery, is a sacrament of healing. As is demonstrated in the Scriptures, God's healing came through Jesus to the people in various ways – physically, emotionally, and spiritually. Anointing of the Sick (see James 5:14-15 for scriptural foundations) avails us to this healing power of the Holy Spirit in whichever way God sees best for our eternal good and need. Please sit in the front pews of the church following Mass (sitting every other row) if you would like to receive this powerful sacrament.
