Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

1. Today we begin **Holy Week** – the holiest week of our Christian calendar. See the listing in today's bulletin for all the special Masses and other services that will occur during the week. The more you can attend, the more you will be able to consecrate this week and enter more deeply into Jesus' suffering, death, and resurrection for you personally and for all people of all time.
2. On Tuesday, March 27th our **Parish Penance Service** will be held starting at 7pm. There will be about 10 priests from our local area here that evening hearing Confessions!! Please plan to attend as a family and make this opportunity for Reconciliation a part of your Lenten journey toward Easter. If you are unable to attend that evening, other penance services in the area are listed in this week's bulletin so you can go to Confession during Lent. Additionally, Confession will be offered March 27th in the morning after the 9am Mass.
3. Speaking of Holy Week, allow me to highlight a very special **prayer service on Good Friday** beginning at **3pm in the social hall**. *The Passion through the Eyes of Mary* will again be presented this year. It is a very touching and unique way to remember the Passion of our Lord.
4. Please note that on **Saturday, March 31st** there will be NO 5pm Mass (with Confessions prior). Rather, the Easter Vigil will begin at 8pm that evening. Sunday Masses on Easter Sunday follow the usual schedule: 8:15am and 11:15am.
5. A very **special thank you** to the Knights of Columbus for organizing the Friday Lenten Dinners and the St. Patrick's Day celebration this year. They were really wonderful events.
6. **SAVE THE DATE:** After all the Masses on the weekend of **April 14 and 15**, we will have a special **Ministry Fair** for a celebration of the many ministries and organizations supported by our fellow parishioners here at Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish. All parishioners are invited to visit the fair in the social hall. More information to come.

GOOD FRIDAY COLLECTION – The Good Friday Collection supports the people of the Holy Land and the pilgrims who visit. A portion of the funds are directly allocated to educational and ecclesial projects in the Middle East. The rest of the funds collected in the US and a number of other countries support ministries and programs entrusted by the Holy See to the Holy Land Franciscans. Last year's Pontifical Good Friday Collection supported 29 parishes, four homes for orphans, three academic institutions; helped keep schools open for over 10,000 pre-k through grade 12 students; supported 120 men preparing to be priests or brothers; helped rehabilitate 80 homes for

Christian families; provided senior care facilities in Bethlehem and Nazareth; created 1500- jobs in the Holy Land for Christians; and preserved 54 shrines connected with the life of Jesus and the prophets.

LENTEN APPEAL – It is with deep gratitude from both Bishop Gainer and I for your devotion to the Bishop's Annual Lenten Appeal. To date we have pledged \$69,755.00 toward our goal of \$60,100. Just as Jesus demonstrated His love for us in his willingness to suffer, this Lent we have an opportunity to continue His loving ministry through the sacrificial gift we are willing to make. We must never tire of demonstrating our love for the Lord by loving and helping our brothers and sisters most in need. REMINDER: every dollar that we exceed our goal is refunded to our parish, unrestricted.

CREMATION

Since 1963, Catholics have been allowed to choose cremation over burial as a means of laying a loved one to rest. Cremation is a popular choice since it is less expensive and more manageable than a full burial. Cremation, like death, is final. But that doesn't mean you won't have second thoughts. Susan Skiles Luke, a marketing consultant in Columbia, Missouri, had her mother cremated and buried in a family plot. Now, she wishes it was her mother's body and not just the cremated remains that was in the grave. “When I go there, which isn't often, I want to feel like her body is under ground, right alongside my grandparents and beloved great aunt, all dressed up in their Sunday best...”

Although creation is permitted, some Catholics have not been dealing properly with their loved ones remains. Common practices include scattering ashes, parting ashes out to friends and relatives, and keeping the ashes in a common area, such as a living room. While scattering ashes may seem romantic to some (but is also contrary to Catholic teaching), there's something to be said about keeping your loved one in once place, and then marking that place with a name. “We mark the graves of our loved ones with a headstone to memorialize them, so we don't forget them”. When visiting that person's grave, just seeing his or her name can give comfort.

To instruct the faithful in this regard, the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith has issued updated guidelines. According to these, burial is still preferred, but cremation is an option. When a loved one has been cremated, their ashes must be kept intact, the same as one would treat a body. The ashes may not be separated or scattered. Instead, they should remain in a proper vessel that is interred in a proper place, such as a cemetery or church. Finally, the document stresses that Catholics who choose cremation for reasons contrary to the faith, (e.g., to have their ashes scattered) must be denied a Christian funeral.

In the end, whether cremation or burial is chosen, we await from the grave the second coming of Jesus Christ and the blessed Resurrection of the Dead.

Marcoe to know of your hospitalization, please inform the parish office before going into the hospital OR once hospitalized, ask the nurse or hospital chaplain/pastoral care staff person to notify the parish.
