SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

In today's Gospel the devil presents three temptations to Jesus. The devil tempts Jesus to use his power to appease his hunger; he tempts Jesus to put God's promise of protection to the test; and he offers Jesus all of the kingdoms of the world if Jesus will worship the devil. In each case, Jesus resists the temptation, rebuking the devil with words from Scripture.

Each temptation offers insight into both God and the human condition. Jesus' rejection of the temptations shows that he will not put God to the test. Grounding himself on the word and authority of Scripture, Jesus rebukes the devil, confident in God's protection and faithfulness.

As we start our journey through Lent, we are called to adopt the same confidence that Jesus had in the face of temptation: God's word alone will suffice; God's promise of protection can be trusted; God alone is God.

1st Sunday of Lent

1. Welcome to the first Sunday of Lent! Please allow me to highlight that **Confessions** will be heard each **Wednesday evening** of Lent from 5:30 to 6pm in the church, followed by **Mass** at 6pm. There will be NO 9am Masses on Wednesdays during Lent, except for April 12. Also, each Friday of Lent, except for Good Friday, **Lenten Fish Fry Dinners** (sponsored by the Knights of Columbus) will be held in the social hall from 4:45 to 6:45pm, and then **Stations of the Cross** will take place in the church at 7pm. All are encouraged to participate as you are able.
2. **Lenten Lunches** (offered by the Abbottstown-East Berlin ministerium) are beginning. The first one is this Wednesday, March 8th, right here at our very own IHM! Then, I will be preaching at Emmanuel UCC in Abbottstown on March 29th. Each afternoon begins with lunch at 12noon and ends by 1pm – all are welcome. No need to register in advance just show up. DISPENSATION FOR THE FEAST OF SAINT PATRICK – This year the Feast of Saint Patrick falls on a Lenten Friday. Since Saint Patrick is the principal patron of our diocese, Most. Rev. Ronald W. Gainer has granted a dispensation from Friday abstinence to all Catholics **who reside in the diocese** and **all who are present within the Diocese** on March 17, 2017. Those who take advantage of this dispensation are urged to substitute another suitable form of personal penance, possibly choosing another day within the Second Week of Lent as a Day of Lenten abstinence.

BISHOP'S ANNUAL LENTEN APPEAL – Your gift to the Bishop's Annual Lenten Appeal extends your generosity beyond your parish to reach those in our larger Catholic family. Immaculate Heart of Mary receives full credit for your gift. Once our goal has been reached, the parish receives all of the "over goal" gifts for our own essential needs. The in-pew pledge process will be conducted the weekends of March 18/19 and March 25/26.

CHILDREN'S CHAPEL – For everyone's information, especially for those who may be new to our parish, there is a so-called **Children's Chapel** or **Cry Room** here in the Church. It's located in the front left corner of the church, where a restroom is also located. As a parish family, we want children and families to be welcome here at Mass, and so it's important to have an appropriate place in the church for babies and young children when they get fussy and need extra attention. I really want to encourage parents to use this space to tend to your children as needed. Please, feel free to just get up when need be from the body of the church, and utilize this space. Then you can better tend to your children without feeling like you're being watched. And this will also allow the other parishioners to be able to more fully focus on worshipping.

50TH WEDDING ANNIVERSARY – Were you married in 1967? This year's 50th Anniversary Mass will be held on Sunday, July 9, 2017 at 2 PM at Good Shepherd Parish in Camp Hill. Anyone celebrating their 50th Wedding Anniversary this year should contact Anita in the parish office no later than April 20th. In addition to the Mass, which will be celebrated by Bishop Ronald W. Gainer, there will be a reception for the couples and their families. It is a time of inspiration, instruction, fellowship, and spiritual growth. I highly recommend to the men of our parish that if you have not yet registered, to please consider doing so. There will be men at the doors of our church today handing out registration brochures. Dr. Peter Kreeft, one of the foremost Catholic authors and speakers in the country is keynoting the conference, there will be 38 workshops in also, Bishop Gainer will also be celebrating Mass and presenting one of the workshops, there will be Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament with Benediction and the praying of the Rosary during the Holy Hour. There will also be about 25 different Priests who will be hearing Confessions at various times throughout the day. There will be food, good Catholic exhibits and fellowship with men throughout our Diocese and beyond. It is great time of spiritual renewal. This is the 6th year for the Men's Conference and it has grown every year. There were 925 men who attended last year. The hope is that 1,000 men will attend this year.
