SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

On this fifth Sunday of Lent, we encounter yet another miracle --- the raising of Lazarus. Mary and Martha, the sisters of Lazarus, send word to Jesus that his friend is ill. Jesus is said to love Mary, Martha, and Lazarus, but he delays his journey for two days. When Jesus finally declares that he will journey to Bethany, his disciples fear for his life.

The scene described at Bethany is a sad one. Martha meets Jesus weeping and saying that if Jesus had been there, Lazarus would not have died. Yet she remains confident that God will do whatever Jesus asks. Martha affirms her belief that there will be a resurrection of the dead in the last days. Then Martha's sister, Mary, comes to Jesus with the same confidence, saying that Jesus could have cured Lazarus. Jesus asks to be brought to Lazarus's tomb where he prays and calls Lazarus out from the tomb. At this sign, many come to believe in Jesus, but others take word of the miracle to the Jewish authorities, who begin their plans for Jesus' death.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

5th Sunday of Lent

1. **Reminder** – each Wednesday evening of Lent Mass is at 6pm (preceded by Confessions starting at 5:30pm). Also, Stations of the Cross take place each Friday evening at 7pm.
2. The final **Soup and Sermon** takes place on April 5th at Zwingli UCC in East Berlin. A simple Lenten meal begins at 12 noon in the social hall. At 12:30, a short service starts, and a sermon is given by an area pastor. By 1pm, we're all finished. Popular Lenten hymns and prayers are part of the service. All are invited to join in.
3. On Tuesday, April 11th our **Parish Penance Service** will be held starting at **7pm**. There will be about 10 priests from our local area here that evening hearing Confessions!! Please plan to attend as a family and make this opportunity for Reconciliation a part of your Lenten journey toward Easter. If you are unable to attend that evening, other penance services in the area are listed in this week's bulletin so you can go to Confession during Lent. Additionally, Confession will be offered April 11th in the morning from after Mass until 10:30am.
4. The question is often asked? **Why do I have to go to Confession** – why can't I just confess my sins directly to God? Let's ask the question this way: Is the person who confesses his or her sins to a priest any better off than someone who confesses directly to God? Yes. First, he or she seeks forgiveness the way Christ intended (see John 20:21-23). Second, by confessing to a priest, the person learns a lesson in humility, which is avoided when one confesses only through private prayer. Third, the person receives sacramental graces that someone who does not go to Confession does not receive; through the Sacrament of Reconciliation sins are forgiven and graces are obtained. Fourth, the person is assured that his or her sins are forgiven; he does not have to rely on a subjective "feeling." Lastly, the person can also obtain sound counsel or advice on avoiding sin in the future. So, yes, it's worth going to Confession. That's why God gave His Church is sacrament.
5. Do you want to deepen your faith and learn how to share it more effectively? Do you want to grow in your personal relationship with God? Do you want to help those who have left the faith reconnect with Jesus? There is a powerful book that I mentioned previously in a homily called, **Forming Intentional Disciples** (Our Sunday Visitor Publishing Division, 2012) by author Sherry Weddell (a convert to Catholicism). I can't tell you how highly I recommend this book. It is available for purchase at Our Sunday Visitor.
