Dear parishioners of Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish,

While the pastor has ultimate responsibility for the parish, according to canon law and diocesan law, he is to have the assistance of parishioners in planning for the spiritual well-being of the parish.

In the most recent guidelines for Parish Pastoral Councils, then Bishop Joseph P. McFadden said “Parish Pastoral Councils are an essential element of parish life and an invaluable resource to pastors in providing good pastoral leadership for the overall life of the parish.” He went on to say: “In the parish we share *one mission* and together live out that mission *through our worship and through the parish programs, ministries and activities*. Everything that happens in the parish must be connected. Everyone must understand and experience this connectedness and common purpose.” And as Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI once stated, “We cannot communicate with the Lord if we do not communicate with one another.”

Our parish family is blessed with enthusiastic parishioners who have volunteered to serve on our Pastoral Council and give of their time and talent in assisting me in various ways in providing that leadership to carry out our parish's vision and mission statements. Such assistance generally takes the form of suggestions and other council they offer, acting as liaisons with the various parish ministries and organizations, and serving as representatives of the parish at large. Please take advantage of their office by approaching them with questions, suggestions, ideas, comments and other considerations for the good of our parish family.

The Parish Pastoral Council has also helped me in the compilation of this resource, the goal of which is to help all of our parishioners connect to the larger vision and mission of our parish. In other words – we all have a specific role to play in being part of the Body of Christ, the Church. As you read through these pages, I would ask you to ask yourself the question: “How is God calling me to *intentionally* follow and serve Him as a disciple of His Son, specifically here at Immaculate Heart of Mary?” May God continue blessing our great parish.

Vision Statement for Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish

Each member of our congregation has beliefs, wishes, and dreams which create the vitality and unique identity of our parish family. Acting as elected representatives of our parish, the Pastoral Council, along with our Pastor, Father Marcoe, envision our Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish to be “**a vibrant, active, faith-filled community united as one holy parish family**”.

Mission Statement for the Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish

In following the Catholic Church's teaching of the vision of Jesus Christ, and the hopes and dreams of our parish, the Pastoral Council, along with our Pastor, Father Marcoe, has articulated our parish's mission as follows: “**Immaculate Heart of Mary is a Roman Catholic parish family called to be disciples of Jesus Christ, fostering spiritual growth in our worshipping community; encouraging greater participation in living and sharing the Catholic faith through prayer and action; and providing for the benefit of individuals, families, and the larger community.**”

Our Mission Statement, in turn, has been “made flesh” through the goals and objectives that are laid out in our Parish Pastoral Plan.

Parish Pastoral Plan

"Under the direction of the pastor and in collaboration with the pastoral staff, the Parish Pastoral Council and the Parish Finance Council, the parish should develop a long range 3-5 year pastoral plan."

Under the direction of our pastor, Father Marcoe, each aspect of our parish Mission Statement will be accomplished through the goals, objectives, and activities of the various parish ministries and organizations coordinated under the individual Pastoral Council member's assigned missions.

Pastoral Plan 2015 – 2020

Mission for Evangelization

1. Develop and maintain a program of outreach to inactive Catholics with home visits, potentially with the support of the Legion of Mary.
2. Continue developing and maintaining Small Christian Communities as a network.
3. Enrich the evangelistic efforts of ministries such as the Legion of Mary and the Charismatic Prayer Group.
4. Strengthen our parish connection and support of the Cursillo movement.
5. Potentially enhance parish outreach to single, divorced, and widowed Catholics.
6. Develop an evangelization committee to coordinate outreach.
7. Help parishioners to have a more active involvement in their faith through participation in existing or new parish ministries or organizations.
8. Help parishioners to have a more active involvement in their faith through supporting family life (the “domestic church”) through new initiatives.

Mission for Education

1. Continue our strong support of Catholic Schools (given the results of the Adams Deanery School Study). To encourage our parents to send their children to deanery Catholic schools, as possible.
2. Continue and enhance our quality religious Education Program (CCD) for pre-school through 8th grade, which includes sacramental preparation, summer Vacation Bible School, and other opportunities for children to grow in faith.
3. Continue developing our new High School Youth Ministry program, and eventually seek to develop a new Junior High Youth Ministry program, allocating budget funds for these ministries, with the possibility of hiring a professional for part-time ministry.
4. Have quality programs for adults with Bible Study Groups, Small Christian Communities (of different varieties), sacramental preparation (as needed), workshops and seminars to enhance faith formation.
5. Continue enhancing RCIA programs for catechumens and candidates, both for adults and children.
6. Organize and enhance our parish library, making it more visible and available to parishioners.

Mission for Pastoral Ministry

1. Foster a sense of belonging and community among members of the parish, and provide support through programs, ministries, and activities which strengthen and support the parish as a community of faith.
2. Continue promoting and expanding various social groups and activities, such as the Adopt a Flower Bed Club, various picnics and socials, and the Adventure (travel) Club.
3. Continue enhancing parish the Mentor Couple program, Respect Life, and other ministries and organizations of the parish.
4. Fill currently vacant ministries and organizations of the parish (such as Catholic School Liaison, Parish Archives, Outreach to Inactive Catholics, etc.).
5. Continue fostering better means of communication between the parish and the parishioners (ex. Facebook, parish website, keeping parishioners up-to-date through announcements at Mass, and potentially establishing a parish newsletter).

Mission for Liturgy

1. Review Sacramental celebrations, especially Eucharist, Reconciliation, Baptism, Marriage, and Anointing of the Sick, along with catechesis and formation.
2. Enhance the choir, cantor, and music ministries.
3. Enhance the overall spirituality of the parish (through missions and retreats, and other educational opportunities of growth and formation) to help parishioners be full, active, and conscious participants in the liturgy and intentional disciples of Jesus Christ in their personal and family lives.
4. Consider re-developing the Parish Liturgy Committee.

Mission for Social Concerns and Outreach

1. Continue expanding support to the Abbottstown-East Berlin Food Pantry.
2. Expand opportunities for parishioners to participate in mission trips domestically and internationally.
3. Re-establish and expand our Parish caring Committee, as needed.

Mission for Ecumenism and Interfaith Concerns

1. Continue working with area ministers and pastors in the Abbottstown-east Berlin Ministerium in joint areas of social action, education, worship, and faith formation.
2. Support married couples in inter-faith marriages in various ways.
3. Continue participating in regular ecumenical services for Lent and Advent, and also during the week of Prayer for Christian Unity.
4. Foster unity, discussion, and dialogue in the public square about topics of life, religious liberty, conscience protection, social action, and public witness.
5. Support, as possible, new initiatives of the Ministerium (such as a new “Pub Theology” group to meet locally).

Mission of Financial Administration and Stewardship / Buildings and Grounds

1. Maintain a healthy budget with a balanced budget report; no deficit spending or debt; monitor income and expenses; maintain savings account with a robust balance.
2. Explore and implement an expanded Stewardship program (Time, Talent, and Treasure)
3. Continue with church renovations (inside and outside, as needed), including landscaping, repairing church windows/Plexiglas, restoring the steeple and facade of the church, etc.
4. Potentially re-create part time parish manager position
5. Upgrade parish computer systems

Parish Pastoral Council

Following are excerpts from the letter of April 29, 2013 from Bishop of Harrisburg, Joseph P. McFadden, promulgating to Pastors and Parish Pastoral Councils, “Norms and Guidelines for Parish Pastoral Councils.”

Parish Pastoral Councils are an essential element of parish life and an invaluable resource to pastors in providing good pastoral leadership for the overall life of the parish. The role of the Parish Pastoral Council is to invite everyone in the parish into a closer relationship with God.

Each parish must establish areas of mission that encompass every goal and activity within the parish. The ministry of evangelization and spreading the good news of Jesus Christ is shared by all of us. May we continue to work to strengthen parish life and our service to the people of God.

All committees, groups, etc. in every aspect of parish life will be part of one of the mission areas of the Parish Pastoral Council. All committees, groups, etc. in every aspect of parish life must communicate and cooperate with the Parish Pastoral Council, which is responsible for evaluating the effectiveness of each organization and supporting each one as it carries out the parish mission statement, which is further delineated in our Parish Pastoral Plan.

Anyone wishing to attend a Parish Pastoral Council meeting is welcome to do so (some exceptions might be made for issues such as discussions pertaining to personnel issues or preliminary budget work). Parish Pastoral Council meeting dates are usually listed in the Bulletin.

Anyone wishing to address the Parish Pastoral Council on any topic may do so, but for sake of time and relevance to the Council, will need to contact the Parish Pastoral Council Chair or the Pastor first.

The basic functions of the Pastoral Council members

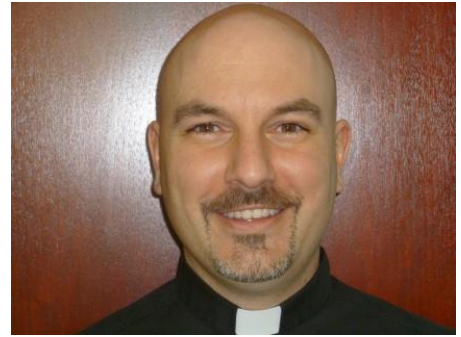
